Passage #1 Isaiah 45: 9-11

Passage #2

Isaiah 65:17-19

17 "For behold, I create new heavens

and a new earth, and the former things shall not be remembered or come into mind.

18 But be glad and rejoice forever

in that which I create; for behold, I create Jerusalem to be a joy, and her people to be a gladness. 19 I will rejoice in Jerusalem

and be glad in my people; no more shall be heard in it the sound of weeping and the cry of distress.

Instructions for Writing a Collect Prayer:

You: descriptive name addressing God

Who: attribute or past action of God or something in the Bible

Do: make a request based on the character of God you highlighted

To: the reason for the request

Through: affirms the Trinity of Jesus' meditations

Glossary:

Sex: the gender that you were assigned at birth, or your biological gender

Gender: how you identify, where you fall on the gender-spectrum

Cisgender: when your sex and gender are the same (e.g.: I was born female, and I identify as female)

Gender Expression: how someone expresses their gender in regards to their outward appearance (whether through clothes, makeup, etc.)

Non-Binary: Someone who does not feel that they fit within the binary categories (male and female), rather they are somewhere in the middle. Often they will use they/them/theirs pronouns or a mix of pronouns.
