THE HEBREW SCRIPTURE

Lector: A Reading from Jeremiah.

Jeremiah 22: 13-16 Read by Priscilla Coppock

Woe to him who builds his house by unrighteousness, and his upper rooms by injustice;

who makes his neighbours work for nothing, and does not give them their wages;

who says, "I will build myself a spacious house with large upper rooms",

and who cuts out windows for it, panelling it with cedar, and painting it with vermilion.

Are you a king

because you compete in cedar?

Did not your father eat and drink and do justice and righteousness? Then it was well with him.

He judged the cause of the poor and needy; then it was well.

Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me; for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light."

THE GREAT THANKSGIVING

Celebrant: God be with you and with all creation.

People: And also with you. Celebrant: Open your hearts.

People: We open our hearts to God.

Celebrant: Let us give thanks to God, Maker of heaven and earth.

People: It is right to thank our God.

Celebrant: It is right to give you thanks, loving God. Your Word is the impulse for all things to be, for

space, stars, and stardust to appear, for order to emerge from chaos, for all life to be born of

Earth and the Spirit. You made us stewards of this fragile Earth, our island home.

In Jesus you chose to be born, to suffer, to die, to rise from death to redeem humankind, to

restore Creation, and to reconcile all born of Earth and the Spirit.

Your Presence is the living power in all things, the Christ deep among us, filling Earth—land, sea, and air; filling every element and place, filling the grain and the grape we share with you

this day.

Therefore with angels and archangels, saints and sinners, ancient voices in the forest, high voices from the sky, deep voices from the sea, and the whole company of Creation, we proclaim your presence in and among us.

People: Holy, holy, holy Lord,

Then the Celebrant continues:

All glory to you, Giver of life abundant for all Creation. Accept our praises for Jesus the Christ, the one perfect offering for the world, who on the night he was betrayed, took bread, and when he had given thanks, broke it, gave it to his disciples, and said: "Take, eat, this is my body which is given for you; do this to remember me."

After supper he took the cup; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them and said: "Drink this, all of you. This is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you, and for all, to forgive sin. Do this as often as you drink it to remember me."

Therefore, God of All Existence, in the suffering and death of Jesus our Redeemer, we meet you in your glory. We lift up the cup of salvation and call upon your name. Here and now, with this bread and wine, we celebrate your great acts of liberation, ever present and living in Jesus the Christ, crucified and risen, who was and is and is to come.

All: Amen! Come Lord Jesus.

In Christ we offer ourselves to do your will. Infuse us with your Holy Spirit, feed us with your life, fire us with your love, confront us with your justice, and make us one in the body of Christ with all who share your gifts of love.

ALL:

Through Christ, in the power of the Holy Spirit, with all who stand before you on earth and all Creation, we worship you, our Loving Creator God. AMEN.
