THE COLLECT FOR PURITY

Celebrant: Alleluia. Christ is risen.

People: The Lord is risen indeed. Alleluia.

Celebrant: Almighty God, to you all hearts are open, all desires known, and from you no secrets are hid: cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love you and worthily magnify your holy name; through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

THE COLLECT OF THE DAY

Celebrant: The Lord be with you.

People: And also with you.

Celebrant: Let us pray.

Unbounded Creator, your goodness is deeper than the oceans and higher than the mountains; you breathe life into our small planet, which shares a vastness of space beyond our understanding. Because of your Divine Love, this fragile Earth, our island home, and all the mysteries of the universe exist. Grant us the humility to see our place in the whole of Creation, and to know how precious is our Planet Earth, deserving of our whole-hearted stewardship. We ask this in the name of the Risen Christ, who reconciles and renews all Creation. **Amen.**

THE HEBREW SCRIPTURE

Reader: A Meditation on the Genesis story of Creation.

Genesis 1-2:3 Read by Judith Anthony

"And God said, 'Let there be light'; and there was light." Light is at the very heart of life: within the brilliance of the morning sun, in the whiteness of the night moon.

THE PEOPLE'S RESPONSE: Light manifests in all that grows and in the beating heart of every living creature.

READER: "And God said, 'Let there be a dome in the midst of the waters, and let it separate the waters from the waters." This creative energy is the wildness of God, making the wild winds to sweep over the face of the waters.

RESPONSE: The Mystery of God is eternally unfolding on earth, in sea and sky.

READER: "And God said, 'Let the waters under the sky be gathered into one place, and let the dry land appear.' And it was so." God uttered creation forth from the heart of the Universe. From the seas emerged our island home that God called Earth. *"And God saw that it was good."*

RESPONSE: Divine Goodness is at the very heart of all that is and we are born of that goodness.

READER: "And God said, 'Let there be lights in the dome of the sky . . . to give light upon the earth.' And it was so. God made two great lights—the greater light to rule the day and the lesser light to rule the night—and the stars." The sun, moon and stars shine out of the darkness of space, expressing the wonder and mystery of God.

RESPONSE: The wonder of God is the mystery of our lives, for we are made in God's image. How wonderful is that!

READER: "And God said, 'Let the waters bring forth swarms of living creatures." Out of the waters of God's life come the creatures of earth, sea and sky.

RESPONSE: Let us celebrate all the creatures of the world; their diversity expresses the ever-expanding creativity of God.

READER: "God created humankind in God's image." To say that we are made in the image of the Divine is to say that what is deepest in us is God.

RESPONSE: At the heart of who we are is the love of God, creativity and the imagination of God.

READER: "God blessed the seventh day and hallowed it, because God rested from all the work that God had done." The six days of creation reveal the wildness of God's creative spirit. The seventh day reveals another essential dimension of God: stillness and rest.

RESPONSE: Just as night follows day, stillness is woven into the fabric of our own nature, bringing rest and renewal.

Oh, Great Mystery of Love, may we be ever thankful as we answer your call to play our part in this sacred web of life on Earth, our Island Home.

Refrain: Sing to the Lord a new song, for God has done wonderful deeds, Sing to the Lord a new song, for God has done wonderful deeds.

Sing to the Lord a new song, for God has done wondrous deeds; Whose right had has won the victory for us, God's holy arm. *Refrain*

The Lord has made salvation known, and justice revealed to all, remembering kindness and faithfulness to Israel. *Refrain*

THE EPISTLE

Lector: A reading from John.

1 John 3:1-7 Read by Cindy Fuqua

See what love the Father has given us, that we should be called children of God; and that is what we are. The reason the world does not know us is that it did not know him. Beloved, we are God's children now; what we will be has not yet been revealed. What we do know is this: when he is revealed, we will be like him, for we will see him as he is. And all who have this hope in him purify themselves, just as he is pure. Everyone who commits sin is guilty of lawlessness; sin is lawlessness. You know that he was revealed to take away sins, and in him there is no sin. No one who abides in him sins; no one who sins has either seen him or known him. Little children, let no one deceive you. Everyone who does what is right is righteous, just as he is righteous.

Lector: This is the Word of the Lord. *All:* Thanks be to God.

THE GOSPEL

Luke 24: 36b-48

Celebrant: The Holy Gospel of our Savior Jesus Christ according to Luke. *People:* Glory to you, O Christ.

Jesus himself stood among the disciples and said to them, "Peace be with you." They were startled and terrified, and thought that they were seeing a ghost. He said to them, "Why are you frightened, and why do doubts arise in your hearts? Look at my hands and my feet; see that it is I myself. Touch me and see; for a ghost does not have flesh and bones as you see that I have." And when he had said this, he showed them his hands and his feet. While in their joy they were disbelieving and still wondering, he said to them, "Have you anything here to eat?" They gave him a piece of broiled fish, and he took it and ate in their presence.

Then he said to them, "These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you—that everything written about me in the law of Moses, the prophets, and the psalms must be fulfilled." Then he opened their minds to understand the scriptures, and he said to them, "Thus it is written, that the Messiah is to suffer and to rise from the dead on the third day, and that repentance and forgiveness of sins is to be proclaimed in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things.

THE GREAT THANKSGIVING

Celebrant	The Lord be with you.
People	And also with you.
Celebrant	Lift up your hearts.
People	We lift them to the Lord.
Celebrant	Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.
People	It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Celebrant: God of all power, Ruler of the Universe, you are worthy of glory and praise. **Glory to you for ever and ever.**

At your command all things came to be: the vast expanse of interstellar space, galaxies, suns, the planets in their courses, and this fragile earth, our island home.

By your will they were created and have their being.

From the primal elements you brought forth the human race, and blessed us with memory, reason, and skill. You made us the rulers of creation. But we turned against you, and betrayed your trust; and we turned against one another.

Have mercy, Lord, for we are sinners in your sight.
