**Upgraded Air Filters**

Earlier this summer, our Vestry approved the purchase of upgraded HVAC filters (MERV 13) that could improve our system's efficacy in removing viruses from circulated air. Although we placed the order for these filters in July, the fulfillment of that order has taken nearly 7 weeks. We are excited to announce that last week we finally received the filters and we have installed them for use in our sanctuary. Note: *Using upgraded HVAC filters is not enough to protect people from COVID-19, but when used along with other best practices recommended by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, an upgraded HVAC filter can be part of a plan to ourselves and our loved ones when we gather for worship.*

**The Return of Intinction**

**Today, we will provide both bread and wine at the communion rail.** The priests will distribute the wafers with a Lay Eucharist Minister (LEM) following behind with a chalice for intinction. While the wine will be available, it is not necessary that you receive both bread and wine. **Those who wish to continue receiving communion in one kind only should simply consume the bread once they receive it and cross themselves if offered wine by the LEM.** Those who wish to receive both elements, should hold the bread given to them by the priest and wait for the LEM to bring them the chalice. Once the chalice is made available to them, they may dip the wafer into the wine and then receive the elements together.

Then Jesus looked around and said to his disciples, “How hard it will be for those who have wealth to enter the kingdom of God!” And the disciples were perplexed at these words. It is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for someone who is rich to enter the kingdom of God.” They were greatly astounded and said to one another, “Then who can be saved?” Jesus looked at them and said, “For mortals it is impossible, but not for God; for God all things are possible.” Peter began to say to him, “Look, we have left everything and followed you.” Jesus said, “Truly I tell you, there is no one who has left house or brothers or sisters or mother or father or children or fields, for my sake and for the sake of the good news, who will not receive a hundredfold now in this age—houses, brothers and sisters, mothers and children, and fields with persecutions—and in the age to come eternal life. But many who are first will be last, and the last will be first.”
