

Book Club: An Intergenerational Conversation on Care of Creation

Kimberly Nicholas, author of *Under the Sky We Make: How to Be Human in a Warming World*, (Putnam, 2021) writes:

"We need people with the courage and compassion and imagination to transform themselves, and society, in ways that science tells us are necessary... Each of us can become that sort of person; more and more... every day."

Nicholas is a climate scientist, but her book reads more like a personal memoir. And while she does not write from a Christian faith perspective, but she does do a very good job mapping out the emotional and cultural terrain of our contemporary world.
