#### From Rev Judy:

Dear Friends,

What a beautiful relief this day has been, overcast and not humid! A little dusky, perhaps, a sort of day that beckons you to slow down. Well, Tuesdays at Reconciliation are anything but days to slow down. From staff meetings, phone calls, pastoral inquiries following on Sunday, preparations for Wednesday email and .... Well, you get the picture, the day can all but get away from you.

Yet, the greatest gift to me continues to be the midweek celebration of Holy Eucharist. This liturgy beckons each one of us to slow down, breathe deeply, and notice... notice the gift of this one precious moment, notice the gift of nourishment for our bodies as well as our souls, notice how the Divine shows up for us even in the moments when we don't notice. Imagine, such loving-kindness, such compassion, such faithfulness of the Divine who seeks us out no matter where we are. Who finds us even as we lose ourselves. Who loves us even when we think ourselves to be unlovable.

Even as I begin this full-time ministry among you, I pray for the gift of patience. I pray for the gift of intentional noticing. And I pray for the gift of gratitude and joy rising in my spirit. With you, I enter this interim time, aware of the grace of the Spirit and the invitation to show up and trust... that the Divine is "doing more than I can ask for or imagine possible!" In the words of St. Ignatius of Loyola, "Give me only your love and your grace; for that is enough for me." May it be so. May it be so.
