#### **Military Matters**



## From Rev. Judy:

Dear Reconcilers,

the

One of the books I have been reading and praying with lately is titled, *Ain't Gonna Let NOBODY Turn Me Around: Stories of Contemplation and Justice*, edited by Therese Taylor-Stinson. I decided to read stories that describe experiences of African American Spiritual directors whereby contemplation and justice meet in the day to day lives of ordinary folks like me. No, I was not up for the stories of the "saints" one more time. I wanted, and yes, I needed to hear the struggles of those, who like me are struggling to live more open-hearted, truthful, compassionate, and justice-seeking lives.

Well, it didn't take long for the words of Martin Luther King, Jr., quoted in the introduction to confront me with an absolute truth. King wrote:

Violence never really deals with the basic evil of the situation.

Violence may murder the murderer, but it doesn't murder murder.

Violence may murder the liar, but it doesn't murder lies; it doesn't

establish truth... Violence may go to the point of murdering the hater, but it

doesn't murder hate.

It may increase hate. It is always a descending spiral leading nowhere. This is the ultimate weakness of violence: It multiplies evil and violence in universe. It doesn't solve any problems.

Even as I sat re-awakened to the hard truth of his words, truth is, we are swimming if not some days, drowning in violence of one sort or another every day. And, so often, the characteristics we deny in ourselves we move to "project" on "the other." In last Sunday's sermon, I quoted the Rev. Anna Blaedel from her blog where she talks about the myth of separateness. "You and me, inseparable. We and they, inseparable. Creator, creature, and all creation, in separable. Then and now, inseparable. Divine truths and plants, and rocks and flowers, inseparable. Grief over all being lost and gratitude for all we love, inseparable, too."

At the heart of this truth is our deep human need for connection. Connection with the Divine. Connection with ourselves. Connection with creation. Connection with our neighbors near and far. Connection and relationship which always opens the door for vulnerability, for

hurt along the way, for feelings of inadequacy, anger, betrayal, doubt, and yes, even revenge and violence. So what is it that Jesus would have us do? It would seem to me that we are given multiple examples from Jesus' own life and ministry. He goes apart, not separate but connected deeply to those he has been called to serve. He seeks time apart from the overwhelming voices of threat and violence to listen and be present to his "Abba" - the Source of all life and love. Only then he returns to the intimate connections and friendships that ground his very human life. Only then can he take up his own mission to be Savior and Redeemer.

Cornell West was preaching at Howard University in April, 2011 and said: "Justice is what love looks like in public, just like tenderness is what love feels like in private."

Justice and love, inseparable. Contemplation and action, inseparable. May you and I commit ourselves to the nurture of each of these movements and disciplines in our lives so that we bear the hands and heart of Jesus the Christ to a violent and disturbing world trusting that the we are builders of the Kin-dom of God, together with, and connected to the Divine, one another, and all creation.
